LIVES OF THE SAINTS

The Sobor (Assemblage) of the 70 Apostles Commemorated on January 17/4

The Synaxis (Sobor/Assemblage) of the Seventy Apostles (Disciples) was established by the Orthodox Church so as to indicate the equal honour of each of the Seventy, and to avert dissonance in their veneration. They were chosen by the Lord Jesus Christ, in order to evangelize the Gospel to all the world. Besides the celebration of the Synaxis of the Holy

Disciples, the Church also celebrates the memory of each of them during the course of the year.

With the Descent of the Holy Spirit the disciples preached in various lands. Some accompanied the Apostles from the 12, like the holy Evangelists Mark and Luke, or the companion of the holy Apostle Paul – Timothy, or the disciple of the holy Evangelist John the Theologian – Prochoros, and others. Many of them were thrown into prison for Christ, and many received the crown of a martyr's death.

To the 70 Disciples are enumerated yet two – the holy Disciple Cephas, to whom the Lord appeared after the Resurrection (1 Cor. 15: 5-6), and Simeon, by nickname Niger (Acts 13:1), wherefore they also were glorified by apostolic preaching. The Church in particular venerates and praises the 70 Disciples in that they taught to honour the Trinity One-in-Essence and Un-Divided. In the IX Century the Orthodox Church received from Joseph the Melodist the Kanon for the Day of the Sobor (Assemblage) of the 70 Disciples of Christ.

ORTHODOX WORDS OF THE WEEK

THEOPHANY ("appearance of God") A manifestation of God in His uncreated glory. The revelation of the Holy Trinity at the Baptism of Christ (Luke 3:21-22) is the greatest theophany and is celebrated in the Orthodox Church on January 19/6. It refers also to Christ's resurrection appearances. Other theophanies throughout the Bible include: God appeared to Abraham in the form of three men (Gen. 18:1-15) and to Jacob in a dream (Gen. 28:10-17).

EPIPHANY Literally, "a breaking through from above." The word means a manifestation of God. Examples of epiphanies are the burning bush (Ex 3: 1-6) and the Transfiguration of Christ (Mt 17: 1-13).

The Feast of Theophany is also sometimes referred to as Epiphany by English-speaking Orthodox Christians, but that name more properly refers to the Western Christian feast falling on that same day and commemorating the visit of the Magi to the child Jesus.
