The Sword of Depression (LXX Psalm 101)

An excerpt from Chapter 9 of Donald Sheehan's forthcoming book, *Reflections On Psalms And Psalmic Prayer*

The sword of depression is the despondency that cuts off prayer, which in turn cuts off our living connection to the Creator. We must engage in spiritual (not psychological) warfare, meeting the sword of depression with the shield of psalmic prayer with such strength and personal presence that the enemy's sword breaks against our shield.

As penitents, we live on earth as guerilla fighters in enemy territory. The fighter's starting point in repentance is the knowledge that his own strength is weak; only God's strength is truly good and right. Thus his chief weapon is supplication, spoken outcry to God.

The author looks first at LXX Psalm 136 and then at Psalms 1 and 101, citing Psalm 1 as indicating the way into the endpoint of blessedness: **first**, separating from evil; **second**, bringing our will into the law of God; and **third**, achieving the perfected life in union with God.

He says **depression**, vividly described in Psalm 101, **triumphs when we lose this way and thereby lose who we are by identifying ourselves with how we are.** "In the day I am afflicted, ... I call out to thee," the psalmist cries, and by so doing sharpens the distinction between his personhood and his (temporary) spiritual condition of affliction. That is, in seizing hold of the unceasing aliveness of God, the psalmist pushes back against the overwhelming condition (the how he is) and calls forth the deeper reality of **who he is in relation to who God is**.

He who attains this **and becomes meek and humble of heart**, as if these were his natural dispositions, will unfailingly enter into the Kingdom of Heaven and into the joy of His Lord." +*St. Symeon the New Theologian*
