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#### SUNDAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

"Of all the afflictions that burden the human race, there is not one, whether spiritual or bodily, that cannot be healed by the Holy Scriptures." +Saint John Chrysostom

Epistle: Hebrews 13:7-16

<sup>7</sup>Remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God; consider the outcome of their life, and imitate their faith. 8 Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and for ever. 9 Do not be led away by diverse and strange teachings; for it is well that the heart be strengthened by grace, not by foods, which have not benefited their adherents. <sup>10</sup> We have an altar from which those who serve the tent have no right to eat. <sup>11</sup> For the bodies of those animals whose blood is brought into the sanctuary by the high priest as a sacrifice for sin are burned outside the camp. 12 So Jesus also suffered outside the gate in order to sanctify the people through his own blood. 13 Therefore let us go forth to him outside the camp, and bear the abuse he endured. 14 For here we have no lasting city, but we seek the city which is to come. <sup>15</sup> Through him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge his name. <sup>16</sup> Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.

#### Jesus Prays for His Disciples

**17** When Jesus had spoken these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify thy Son that the Son may glorify thee, <sup>2</sup> since thou hast given him power

over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom thou hast given him. <sup>3</sup> And this is eternal life, that they know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom thou hast sent. <sup>4</sup> I glorified thee on earth, having accomplished the work which thou gavest me to do; <sup>5</sup> and now, Father, glorify thou me in thy own presence with the glory which I had with thee before the world was made.

<sup>6</sup> "I have manifested thy name to the men whom thou gavest me out of the world; thine they were, and thou gavest them to me, and they have kept thy word. 7 Now they know that everything that thou hast given me is from thee; 8 for I have given them the words which thou gavest me, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from thee; and they have believed that thou didst send me. <sup>9</sup>I am praying for them; I am not praying for the world but for those whom thou hast given me, for they are thine; <sup>10</sup> all mine are thine, and thine are mine, and I am glorified in them. 11 And now I am no more in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to thee. Holy Father, keep them in thy name, which thou hast given me, that they may be one, even as we are one. 12 While I was with them, I kept them in thy name, which thou hast given me; I have quarded them, and none of them is lost but the son of perdition, that the scripture might be fulfilled. 13 But now I am coming to thee; and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves.

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# Why have your car blessed next week?

Our annual Blessing of Chariots (cars, trucks, bikes, etc) is next week. It is a custom of Orthodox Christians to have their cars blessed both when newly acquired and on or near the feast of the Prophet Elias (August 2<sup>nd</sup>) as he

ascended into heaven on a fiery chariot.

So why is the blessing of the vehicles so important? In the words of Fr. Gabriel Bilas:

### The Battle: Our common enemy is not of flesh and blood

Many of us are horrified to be witnessing the massive changes that are taking place in our world. It would seem that there are attacks against the very soul of Western Civilization, with Christianity taking the brunt of this attack. At no time in history have we witnessed genocide

against Christians in so many parts of the world. Even in countries that were once bastions of Christianity, we witness atheism, secularism, and Islam, attacking the very heart of the Christian faith

The scandals, sexual and otherwise, that have beset certain parts of Christianity, have also contributed to a mass exodus, with atheism taking possession of the souls of countless people throughout the Western World.

The Church Militant, which is the Church of Christ here on this earth, is in the midst of a battle. In truth, the enemy is not one of flesh and blood, but one of darkness and evil. The survival of humankind is not dependent upon the number of people who accept or reject the true faith, but rather that those who do, activate the fermentation, for just as yeast acts as a starter for bread, so faith in Christ can transform the world, and the entire cosmos.

This is not an age for the faint hearted, but

rather, for those who are willing to commit themselves to this battle as serious Christians, willing to stand up for Christ, and for Truth. Saint Seraphim of Sarov said, "Save yourself, and thousands around you will be saved". Like Saint Seraphim, we must be willing to commit with our whole heart, and our whole mind and body, to the transformational power of the Holy Spirit. This is the only way the powers of darkness can be turned around, and sent back to the depths of hell, where they belong.

THE HOLY FATHERS OF THE FIRST SIX ECUMENICAL COUNCILS are honored on this Sunday. The councils were always called together for a particular reason: to make the Church's teaching and position clear to the world, especially in the face of heresy. Any false

teachings, even though they might have seemed harmless at face value, were regarded as poison that could potentially lead people down the wrong path. These Holy Fathers of the Church, our "lights upon the earth," helped to establish for us a single united faith, rooted in Truth in Christ.

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#### SPIRITUAL CONSIDERATIONS

Emergency Sick Calls – Please notify Fr Dave when you or a family member are going into the hospital or having a procedure so he can pray with you and you may receive the Anointing to be fully prepared.

<u>Mystery of Confession</u> – Opportunities are available <u>after every service</u>, most Saturdays during fasting periods from 11am to 1pm, OR by appointment.

Holy Communion/Eucharist – The reception of the Holy Eucharist is encouraged by all Orthodox Christians who have properly prepared themselves, with fasting from midnight on, regular Confession, and forgiveness for all people. Those who are not Orthodox may receive a blessing from the chalice.

<u>Lapsed Members</u> – You are always welcome home and we want you back! Generally speaking, sincere participation in the Mysteries of Confession, Communion, and regular attendance at the divine services are all that is required to begin parish life anew! See Fr. Dave for specific details.

<u>Baptisms</u> – Two God-parents are required, at least one of whom must be Orthodox by faith (and the other bodies for burning." - Elder Thaddeus of V

a practicing Christian). In the case of infants, the newly-baptized must have one name that is Christian in origin. Parents/grandparents/guardians must also promise to bring the child up in an Orthodox Christian way of life. Please consult Father for more details.

Adult Chrismation – New parishioners are always welcome! In the case of adults seeking entrance into the Church, a period of prescribed catechism will be established with Fr. Dave before administration of the Mysteries. An Orthodox Christian sponsor is also required.

Marriages – are solemnized on Saturdays or Sundays. They are not performed during fasting periods and certain Feast Days. Please consult Father ASAP for more details (before arrangements are made for the hall).

<u>Church Funerals</u> – are provided for practicing Orthodox Christians who are current in their spiritual and financial obligations; otherwise burial is from the funeral home. <u>The Church does not permit cremation</u>.

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"The cremation of bodies is not a Christian act. It is a custom of modern times. The body of a Christian has been sanctified with the Grace of the Holy Spirit, and as such may not be burned. God did not create our bodies for burning." - Elder Thaddeus of Vitovnica
