

THE MEANING OF THE ORTHODOX CHURCH'S MEMORIAL SERVICES BOILED WHEAT (KOLYVA / COLIVA)

The boiled wheat is offered because man is also a seed and like a fruit from the earth. Like a seed he is placed in the

earth now, and he will be raised up and blossom forth again by God's power.

3rd DAY SERVICE

The 3rd day service is celebrated for the reason that the reposed one received his being through the Trinity, and having been translated, he hopes to be changed back to the ancient beauty in which man was first made before the fall, or one better [at the resurrection].

9th DAY SERVICE

The 9th day service is celebrated that his spirit may dwell together with the holy spirits, the angels, since it is immaterial as is their nature. They are ranked according to nine orders, and in three trinities they proclaim and praise God in Trinity.

40th DAY SERVICE

The 40th day service is celebrated in the memory of the Savior's Ascension 40 days after His Resurrection and that the reposed one, when he is resurrected, may be taken up in the clouds to meet the Judge, our Savior and Master, and thus be with Him forever (1Thes. 4:17).



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us." The measure we receive is the measure we give. There is no mercy waiting for us if we do not freely pour out mercy to others.

3rd, 6th, 9TH, AND 12-MONTH SERVICES

Now the third, sixth, and ninth months are also celebrated--to proclaim the Trinity, the God of all and His glory, and on behalf of the deceased. For by the Trinity a man is fashioned, and when he is loosed from

the body he returns to Him, and by the Trinity he hopes for the resurrection. And thus we also perform memorials at the end of the [first] year because we proclaim the Trinity, and the [12month-] year is divided into four trinities. Additionally, the end of the year is celebrated because it is the consummation, and our God the Trinity is the Life of all and the cause of being, and He shall be the restoration of all and the renewal of human nature.

ANNUAL MEMORIAL SERVICES FOR THE DEAD

Each year [thereafter] the relatives observe the memorial of the departed [on the anniversary and on All Soul Saturdays] to demonstrate that he lives and is immortal of soul and he shall be restored when the Creator raises up his body. And the offering of Boiled Wheat (Kolyva) bears witness that, as Christ died according to the flesh and was raised up and lives, thus, we too, as St. Paul says, "shall be raised up and live in Him."

LIVES OF THE SAINTS

The Monk Euthymios the Great

Commemorated on Feb. 2 / Jan. 20

The Monk Euthymios the Great was born to Paul and Dionysia, who were illustrious people and pious Christians, Armenia. They prayed long to have a child. At a young age, Euthymius's father died, leaving him to his mother who then helped him fulfill what had long been the plan for whatever child had been given to them: to join monastic orders.

He went on to become a great monk of his time. The monk commanded young monastics to tackle bodily labour with an inner thought of God. "If laymen,

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 he said, – work much, in order to feed themselves and their families, and besides this, they give alms and offer sacrifice to God, then all the more so ought we as monks to work, so as to avoid idleness and not be nourished by the work of strangers". The abba demanded, that the monks keep silence in church during Divine-services and at meals. He did not allow young monks, wishing to fast more than others of the brethren, to follow their own will, but

urged them to partake of all the food at meals with temperance, not having over-eaten.

The Monk Euthymios died on 20 January in the year 473 at the age of 97 years.
