The prayer to the Holy Spirit, "O Heavenly King", **is not said** at home or in church during this season until the Feast of the Decent of the Holy Spirit: Pentecost (June 20). Instead we say or sing the Paschal Tropar, "Christ is risen from the dead, trampling down death by death..." *(three times)* until the Feast of Ascension (June 10).

During the 50 days from Pascha to Pentecost, we **do not kneel or make prostrations** in church in keeping with the joyful, festal character of the season. We begin to kneel and do prostrations again with the Kneeling Prayers of Pentecost that evening.

SUNDAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

Epistle: Acts 6:1-7

Seven Chosen to Serve

6 Now in these days when the disciples were increasing in number, the Hellenists murmured against the Hebrews because their widows were neglected in the daily distribution. **2** And the twelve summoned the body of the disciples and said, "It is not right that we should give up preaching the word of God to serve tables. **3** Therefore, brethren, pick out from among you seven men of good repute, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may appoint to this duty. **4** But we will devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." **5** And what they said pleased the whole multitude, and they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, and Philip, and Prochorus, and Nicanor, and Timon, and Parmentas, and Nicolaus, a

proselyte of Antioch. **6** These they set before the apostles, and they prayed and laid their hands upon them.

7 And the word of God increased; and the number of the disciples multiplied greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were obedient to the faith.

Gospel: Mark 15:43-16:8

43 Joseph of Arimathea, a respected member of the council, who was also himself looking for the kingdom of God, took courage and went to Pilate, and asked for the body of Jesus. **44** And Pilate wondered if he were already dead; and summoning the centurion, he asked him whether he was already dead. **45** And when he learned from the centurion that he was dead, he granted the body to Joseph. **46** And he bought a linen shroud, and taking him down, wrapped him in the linen shroud, and laid him in a tomb which had been hewn out of the rock; and he rolled a stone against the door of the tomb. **47** Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Jesus saw where he was laid.

The Resurrection of Jesus

16 And when the sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome, bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. **2** And very early on the first day of the week they went to the tomb when the sun had risen. **3** And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the door of the tomb?" **4** And looking up, they saw that the stone was rolled back—it was very large. **5** And entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe; and they were amazed. **6** And he said to them, "Do not be amazed; you seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen, he is not here; see the place where they laid him. **7** But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him, as he told you." **8** And they went out and fled from the tomb; for trembling and astonishment had come upon them; and they said nothing to any one, for they were afraid.

FORTIFYING OURSELVES: We must fortify ourselves with prayer and contrition

If we truly desire to be open to the transformational power of the Holy Spirit in our lives, we must be patient and loving towards others, remembering the words of Saint John of Kronstadt, who said, “Be then indulgent, patient, and loving to those who live with you, and who also suffer from many passions; conquer every evil by good, and, above all, pray to God for them, that He may correct them—that He may turn their hearts to Himself, the source of holiness.”

LIVES OF THE SAINTS

Sts. Mary & Martha, sisters of St. Lazarus (1st c.)
Commemorated on the Sunday of Myrrh-Bearing Women and June 4

Mary and Martha, with their brother Lazarus, were especially devoted disciples of our Lord; their story up to the time of the Resurrection can be found in Luke 10 and John 11-12. Mary and Martha were among the Myrrh-bearing women. They, with their brother, reposed in Cyprus, where Lazarus became first Bishop of Kition after he was raised from death by Christ.

An ancient tradition holds that Lazarus was thirty years old when he was restored to life by the Lord, and that he lived another thirty years. After he was raised from the dead, he never again laughed; but once, when he saw someone stealing a clay pot, he smiled and said, 'Clay stealing clay.' His name is a Greek version of *Eleazar*, meaning 'God has helped.'
